Augusto Villanueva is Associate Professor in Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, New York. He received his medical degree from the University of Santiago de Compostela (Spain), and he is board certified in Gastroenterology and Hepatology (Spain).

Prior to his current position, he was Senior Lecturer and Consultant Hepatologist at the Institute of Liver Studies at King's College Hospital (London) where he led Research and Development.

He currently combines clinical activity as a hepatologist with research focused on understanding the role of intratumor heterogeneity in cancer evolution, and the development of novel minimally invasive biomarkers using liquid biopsy.

He has more than 140 publications (Scopus >17,000 citations, H-index 58) including articles in *N Engl J Med*, *Nat Genet*, *Nat Biotech*, *Nat Commun*, *Gastroenterology*, *Hepatology*, *J Hepatol*, *Gut*, *J Clin Invest*, *Oncogene*, etc. He wrote more than 15 book chapters and edited a book on resistance to targeted therapies in HCC. He served as Associate Editor for *J Hepatol* and *Liver Cancer* and he is the Executive Secretary of the International Liver Cancer Association.
